

ANNEX C: TRONSRUE INDOOR SHOOTING RANGE SAFETY BRIEF

1. Know the four firearm safety rules:

TREAT EVERY WEAPON AS IF IT IS LOADED.

NEVER POINT A WEAPON AT ANYTHING YOU DO NOT INTEND TO SHOOT.

KEEP YOUR FINGER STRAIGHT AND OFF THE TRIGGER UNTIL YOU ARE READY TO FIRE.

KEEP THE WEAPON ON "SAFE" UNTIL YOU INTEND TO FIRE.

2. Safety is everyone's responsibility and paramount while on the range.
3. Anyone can call "cease-fire" if they observe an unsafe act.
4. Upon the command "cease-fire" immediately make a straight trigger finger, place your weapon on safe and await further instructions.
5. Do not go forward of the firing line unless instructed by the Range Safety Officer.
6. Smoking will be done outside of the building.
7. No eating is permitted inside Tronsrue Marksmanship Center.
8. There is absolutely no horseplay, running, or sleeping on the range.
9. Eye protection and hearing protection is mandatory while in the bays.
10. Do not remove your weapon from the holster until told to do so by range personnel. Never bend over with the weapon out of the holster.
11. Ammunition with loose projectiles, cracks, dents, deep scratches or excessive corrosion cannot be fired. Inspect all ammunition for serviceability, and turn in all unserviceable ammunition to the RSO.
12. If a stoppage occurs while firing, attempt to clear the weapon on your own. If you cannot clear your weapon, raise your hand and an instructor will assist you.
13. If recoil, need to you have an audible pop, which normally includes reduced excessive smoke, the weapon not cycling properly, you cease-fire immediately and notify range personnel.
14. Before leaving the firing line clear your firearm. A secondary inspection by the RSO or his designee will be conducted. This inspection will include a visual inspection of the chamber, magazine well, and safety level to ensure that no one leaves the firing line with a loaded firearm.

15. At no time will ammunition or brass leave the range.
16. All dry firing will be done only on the firing line with a condition 4 weapon.
17. Report all negligent, accidental and unauthorized discharges to the RSO and then the range officer.
18. In case of an emergency, place the weapon on safe, keep it pointed down range and follow the RSO's instructions.
19. All injuries, no matter how small, will be reported to management.
