Dear Child and Youth Services Families-

The West Point Child and Youth Services program is pleased to announce the successful completion of this year's **Army Higher Headquarters Inspection (AHHI)**.

Successful completion of the annual AHHI, in addition to the four annual comprehensive inspections, validates an installation's adherence to **over 800 standards** for program facilitation and affords programs their required Department of Defense Certificate to Operate. The AHHI is a demanding inspection that assesses compliance with a large number of critical areas to include, but not limited to, safety, health, sanitation, training, curriculum, environments, interactions and administration. CYS professionals actively participate in this inspection through in-person observations, interviews with AHHI inspectors, remittance and vetting of mandatory documentation, current statistical and analytical data composed of utilization, attendance, staffing, etc., and validation of measures to sustain compliance with standards.

The West Point CYS program has been rated as one of the highest achieving installations for this year's AHHI cycle. This tremendous accomplishment is a direct reflection of each member of the CYS professional team and their commitment to quality as well as the support of our stakeholders. Successful collaboration amongst parents, staff and installation proponents has allowed for continual improvement and application of CYS practices.

Health and Safety Reminders From The CYS Nurse

I hope everyone had a great summer!

I would like to share the following Health and Safety Reminders with you and your family.

- *Please continue the **COVID 19 safety guidelines** by washing your hands for 20 seconds with soap and water. When soap and water are not available, utilize hand sanitizer.
- *Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth
- *Health screening: please monitor yourself and your children for cough, congestion, sore throat, fever, decreased appetite, lethargy, and the absence of taste or smell. Stay home if you or your child are sick.
- *Mask wearing remains optional.
- *Flu season is October 1st-May 31st. Please have your child receive their flu vaccine as required and submit the flu vaccine record to Parent Central before 11/23/2022 for processing.
- *Following each well visit, please forward the updated vaccine record to Parent Central. This will maintain vaccine compliance and prevent an interruption in care.
- *Should a **new medical condition** develop with your child, please contact Parent Central so that the necessary paperwork can be completed by you and your pediatrician. This will enable proper care accommodation.
- *As the **children return to school**, please be sure they are wearing both straps of their backpack distributing the weight. The backpack should weigh only 5%-10% of your child's weight.
- *Teach your child their name, address, and phone number.
- *Encourage children to watch for the crossing guards and obey their signals.
- ***Car safety**: never leave a child unattended in a vehicle. As your child grows have their car seat checked for a proper fit.
- *Fall is continued tick season, shower after outdoor adventures and perform body checks when returning from the outdoors. If bitten, remove tick promptly and mark the calendar, symptoms may develop within two weeks of the bite. Watch for symptoms of joint pain, headache, fever, and a possible bulls-eye red rash. Contact your doctor if symptoms develop.
- *Always **wear a helmet** when biking, rollerblading, motorcycling, horseback riding, or when on an ATV.
