In 2014 Stony CDC underwent playground renovations for 3 out of the 5 existing playgrounds. We are excited to say that IMCOM has recently approved funding to have the 2 remaining playgrounds renovated. This will impact infant - 3 year olds and infants - 18 months. All of the work will be compliant with IMCOM safety standards and the equipment is part of the new Army standard

design. The projected timeline for work to begin is mid-April and should take approximately 4 months until completion. The classrooms effected will be able to utilize an alternate location during this time. Notification will go out to patrons prior to the start of construction as we move closer to the date.

DID YOU KNOW?

The AHHI (Army Higher Headquarter Inspection) is an unannounced higher headquarter inspection of all child and youth programs. This inspection ensures all Army CYS programs meet DoD standards to operate and ensures programs are focused on safety, health and well being of children and youth in CYS programs. Upon successful completion of the AHHI, CYS programs are granted their Department of Defense Certificate to Operate validating the successful implementation of appropriate and enriching programs for community children, youth and families.



Healthy Habits

Program Policy Updates:

Children receiving speech, behavior or occupational therapy while in care at CYS Services facilities must have prior approval by the Multi-disciplinary Inclusion Action Team (MIAT, formerly SNAP). All therapists must undergo background checks pursuant to IMCOM standards. Flu season is here, so don't let the cooties catch you! Use the following tips to keep you and your family safe this flu season. Wash hands often with soap and water, encourage you children to sing the hand washing song twice to ensure maximum effectiveness. Don't know the song? To the tune of Row your Boat sing: Scrub scrub scrub your hands, scrub them nice and clean, scrub the bottom, scrub the top, and fingers in between. Avoid touching your face especially the eyes, nose, and mouth, and cover your cough and sneeze with a tissue or the crease of the elbow. Most of all if you don't feel

well take a day of rest and stay home.

*During this season exclusionary criteria for all childcare centers on post changes. The following guidelines will be in effect until we reach the end of the season: a temperature of 100F and at least one respiratory symptom (runny nose/congestion, cough, and sore throat) or intestinal upset/ diarrhea, non-participation in actives, refusing multiple meals, or complains of joint/body aches. *


