CYS COVID Operational Guidance

The West Point Child and Youth Services program has received updated guidance from Installation Public Health proponents regarding COVID exposures in a child care setting. Please see below for updated guidance. These changes are effective Wednesday, 2 February 2022.

In the event of a COVID positive exposure (generated from a laboratory confirmed test) in a group child care setting the following will occur:

- Contact tracing of affected individuals will be conducted.
- Exposure notice will be provided for parents of affected classrooms.
- Those who have had contact with COVID positive individual and do NOT have symptoms will be directed to self-monitor for a period of 10 days but may remain in care.
- Those who have had contact with COVID positive individual and are symptomatic will be directed to isolate.

5-day isolation will be issued for those who are COVID positive and meet any of the criteria below:

- No longer have symptoms after 5 days (day 0 is the day symptoms start) AND are fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication.
- Are able to effectively wear a mask through Day 10.
- Are 3 years and up.

10-day isolation will be issued for those who are COVID positive and meet any of the criteria below:

- Remain symptomatic after day 5.
- Are not fever free for 24 hours without fever reducing medication.
- Are not able to effectively wear a mask through Day 10.
- Are under 3 years of age.
