School Age Center

The West Point School Age Center (SAC) offers programming for children in kindergarten through fifth grade. SAC provides a variety of experiences for children through planned and developmentally appropriate activities and environments that promote learning and exploration in five services areas. Partnerships with 4-H, the Boys and Girls Clubs of America and Character Counts ensure children are afforded a multi-faceted experience at SAC.

SAC offers the community a before and after school care program, an hourly care program and camps for winter, spring and summer breaks. Before and after school care is offered before school, after school, half days and school out days. Before school care is offered from 0600 until 0830. After school care is offered from 1500 until 1730 Monday, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays and 1400 until 1730 on Wednesdays.

Hourly care is available during the academic year before and/or after school. Hourly care is also available during half day and school out days. Hourly care is \$4 per hour for each child in grades K-5. The SAC program also offers 4 free hours a month for grades 1 through 5. Please inquire within for more additional information on fees and payments.

SAC offers summer camp during the months of June through September.





Summer camp is offered on a weekly basis. Summer camp participants will generally attend one trip to Round Pound, one field trip, and one experience with CYS Sports & Fitness per week along with several activities offered within the facility. Hours of summer camp operations are 0600 to 1800 Monday through Friday.
