AER Financial Readiness Program (FRP) and Army Emergency Relief (AER) (520) 725-3559 / (520) 717-9729

The FRP offers prevention education in personal financial management readiness and consumer affairs to Soldiers and Family members. Services include: Mandatory First-Term Soldier Financial Training, budgeting counseling, retirement and financial planning, debt and credit management and insurance and investment planning.

AER provides loans and grants to eligible Active Duty and Retired Service Members and their Families to assist with emergency financial needs. AER does provide services to West Point Cadets as an exception to policy when there is emergency need for travel assistance.





Relocation Readiness Program (RRP) (520) 717-9823

Family Advocacy Program (FAP) (520) 717-9711

FAP is dedicated to the prevention, education, prompt reporting and intervention of domestic

violence and child abuse. FAP provides a variety of community-based educational opportunities for Soldiers and Families on parenting, anger/stress management and communication skills. Command and troop briefings are offered on the prevention of domestic violence/child abuse. Crisis intervention is available with referral to appropriate agencies. FAP provides victim advocacy services for domestic violence.





Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP) (520) 717-9739
