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


### **Army Higher Headquarters Inspection**

West Point Child and Youth Services (CYS) completed its Annual Army Higher Headquarters Inspection (AHHI). The 2021 inspection was conducted virtually and contained criteria concerning Health, Safety, Sanitation, Patron Communications and Relations, Emergency Preparedness, Program Administration and Staff and Volunteer Background Checks, Orientation, Certifications and Training. CYS staff submitted all required documentation and photographic evidence of over 170 criteria, provided completed Patron Surveys as well as participated in oneon-one inspector interviews to thoroughly represent its daily compliance with the Army's highlevel standards to ensure the health, safety and well-being of children and youth.

We are proud to share that our inspection concluded with CYS meeting all but three criteria. These three criteria are all direct reflections of the loss of childcare spaces in the Child Development Center's closed classrooms due to the current direct-care staffing shortage. CYS Leaders continue to promote its employment opportunities to West Point and its surrounding communities via physical and digital postings and collegiate partnerships; as well as a broader audience via world-wide employment websites, social media and virtual job fairs.

Child and Youth Services will strive daily to sustain these standards and to continue to provide high levels of programming and care. We would like to extend great appreciation on behalf of CYS in its entirety for your Patronage and constant support in maintaining excellence. We ask you as our Patrons to continue to provide the daily communication that has supported CYS in achieving its mission; this communication is imperative to our operations at every level. Your child's direct-care staff, their program's Director and our Child and Youth Services Chief are always available to receive your valued feedback, concerns and cheers.

The Stony Child Development Center went through an extensive self-study and quality-assurance process, followed by an on-site visit by NAEYC Assessors to verify and ensure that the program met each standard and criteria for: child relationships, curriculum, teaching approaches, child assessment, nutrition and health, staff qualification and training, family and community relationships, physical environments and program leadership and management. NAEYC-accredited programs are always prepared for unannounced visits during their accreditation term, which lasts for five years.

The professional staff at the Stony Child Development Center have exhibited their ability to meet the highest benchmarks of professional practice for the education of young children. Achieving NAEYC accreditation is a direct testament to the dedication and proficiency of CDC staff in providing appropriate, coordinated, evidence-based, individualized, outcome oriented experiences for children in cooperation with CYS families.








### Middle School and Teen Center

### Just a few Health and Safety Reminders.

- Please continue the Covid-19 safety guidelines by: washing your hands for 20 seconds with soap and water OR using hand sanitizer when soap and water are not available.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth
- Health Screening: please monitor your children for cough, congestion, sore throat, fever, decreased appetite, lethargy, and the absence of taste or smell. Stay home if you or your child are sick.
- If your child develops a new medical condition, please contact Parent Central so that the necessary updates can be completed by you and your pediatrician. This will support health, safety and proper care accommodations!
- Flu season runs October 1st- May 31st. Please have your child receive their flu vaccine as required before December 1<sup>st</sup> and forward the flu vaccine record to Parent Central.
- Following each well child visit please forward the updated vaccine record to Parent Central, this will maintain vaccine compliance.
- If your child develops a new medical condition, please contact Parent
  Central so that the necessary updates can be completed by you and your
  pediatrician. This will support health, safety and proper care accommodations!
  - As the children return to school, please be sure they are wearing both straps of their backpack evenly distributing the weight. The backpack should weigh only 5%-10% of your child's weight.
  - Teach your child their name, address, and phone number.
  - Watch for the crossing guard and obey their signals.
  - As your child grows have their car seat checked for a proper fit.


